

Cora BURNETT, University of Johannesburg, South Africa

Cora Burnett is a research professor at the University of Johannesburg and holds a doctorate in Human Movement Studies and one in Social Anthropology. She has published extensively in the field of the sociology of sport and sustainable development - about 100 research articles, 47 reports and several books, as well as delivered more than 20 keynote addresses. A recent book has been the southern African version of *Sport in Society* as co-author with Jay Coakley. Over the years she conducted research funded by the IOC, Commonwealth Games Federation, European



Union, the Australian Sports Commission, and CSI research projects such as the Sport for Social Change Network (SSCN) in several African countries. In 2004, she did the national research for Sport and Recreation South Africa (Ministry of Sport) on the *The status of Women and girls in sport and recreation sectors in South Africa* as a decade of reflection after the new democratic dispensation. In 2006 and 2008 she co-led two other national impact assessments on *Siyadlala* and the School Mass Participation Project, with one on the SA public universities to follow in 2010. She is currently leading a national research project on the status of Physical Education in SA public schools with UNICEF as funding agency. She is the Director of the UJ Olympic Studies Centre and involved in multiple 'impact assessment' projects funded by UNICEF and other international donors within the field of 'international development'. She is also the Vice-President of the International Sociology of Sport Association.
